They had been members of Grey Power in Howick and contacted Nelson Grey Power, who needed volunteers with computer skills, Jean says she volunteered to try and retain those skills. Kees also volunteered and finished in 2020 after 10 years of doing shifts on the front desk.

The Grey Power office at that time had

only an Apple computer but its membership lists were not easily accessible on it. The list was on a lengthy sheet of paper which was sent from the National office in Auckland. Jean helped to modernise this and make the membership easier to manage on a new computer system.

The Grey Power office was situated somewhere in the vicinity of the present Post Office/Pharmacy which was the Stoke branch of H&J Smith's shop at that

time. There was a pokey little room by the back entrance to the shop off Strawbridge Square. In that little room behind H&J Smiths we had a table, two chairs and the old Apple. Volunteers sat there filling out forms which were sent to the national office and came back as the kilometre long list.

Some things haven't changed; there is still a frantically busy period of March and April as members renew their mem-

bership but no longer queues out to the street thanks to internet banking. Grey Power still has great volunteers and still has a loyal membership.

Jean finished volunteering on the front desk in 2022 and was nominated for a Life Membership. This means she doesn't need to pay her subscription fee from now on. Grey Power hosted a morning tea in her honour with other volunteers and at the AGM this will be ratified.

Devices giving you grief or are you not sure how to use your mobile phone, tablet or laptop – help is at hand.

# **Total Mobility free travel**

A free transport option was made available from 1st May 2024 for Total Mobility/Ridewise card holders. It provides free travel for all existing and new Mobility Card/Ridewise cardholders on all Nelson/Tasman ebus services.

In addition to free travel for the card

holder. The Accessibility Concession may provide free transport for their "plus one companion". A "plus one companion" is the support person for card holders who are unable to travel independently by bus. The support does not need a Bee card.

To be able to use this concession you need to link your Total Mobility/Ridewise card (which has photo ID) to your Bee Card. To do this you need to take

both cards into either the Nelson City Council or the Tasman District Council. If you do not have a Bee card, you can buy one at the Service Centre for \$5.

A sticker will be placed on your Bee card, but you must still scan your card as you enter and exit a bus. The bus driver may request to see your Total Mobility/Ridewise card, so it is recommended that you carry this with you.
